

U-M Graduates' Law School Admission Matrix, 2011

Rows indicate the mean GPA of admitted applicants. Columns indicate the mean of the **highest** LSAT score of admitted applicants.

This grid illustrates ranges of mean GPA and LSAT scores of UM graduates who gained admission in 2011 to law schools nationwide (organized by group) and released their information back to their UM pre-law advisor through the Law School Admission Council (LSAC). The reverse of this form lists which schools are contained in each group. Even with applicants' release, the LSAC does not disclose GPAs and LSATs when fewer than five individuals from an undergraduate institution were admitted to any given law school. Please remember that the information in this matrix should be compared with national statistics and evaluated within the context of individual applicants' circumstances since LSAT and GPA are not the only criteria utilized by law schools during the selection process.
